

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE BOUNDARIES OF SUBCOUNCILS

The draft Subcouncil By-law proposes new boundaries for 20 subcouncils and clusters joining wards to form these new subcouncils. Council has considered new subcouncil boundaries with the view to:

- 1. Greater synergy in service delivery in aligning subcouncil boundaries with line departments service delivery areas as far as possible;
- 2. Streamlining subcouncil boundaries by reducing the number of subcouncils from 21 to 20 subcouncils;
- 3. Effecting fiscal prudence and contributing to budget austerity measures by reducing the cost of one subcouncil budget.

Notice is hereby given in terms of section 21 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, Act 32 of 2000, the public and interested parties or groups are given the opportunity to submit comments or suggestions to the municipality from 9 July 2024 until 30 July 2024.
