



HAVE YOUR SAY! DRAFT TRAFFIC CALMING POLICY UPDATE

The City invites all interested and affected parties to provide comments on the updated draft of its Traffic Calming Policy. This policy serves as a guideline to help the City assess and manage applications for traffic calming measures across the city.

Aligned with the City's Comprehensive Integrated Transport Plan (CITP) and Road Safety Strategy, the policy aims to reduce deaths and injuries by creating safer streets for everyone. Achieving this requires more than just engineering solutions or traffic enforcement. It calls for sustainable interventions that encourage responsible driver behaviour and greater road safety awareness among all road users.

Key objectives of the draft policy include establishing a sustainable programme that:

- Protects the most vulnerable road users, especially where they are most at risk
- Recognises roadways as public assets meant for all users
- Addresses urgent road safety issues on residential streets as they arise

In terms of section 17 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, Act 32 of 2000, the public and interested parties or groups are given the opportunity to submit comments, recommendations or input on this draft policy to the municipality from Friday 15 August to Saturday 13 September 2025.
